Ready Readers

Five Practices of Reading Readiness



Talking

Talking is one of the very first activities that parents can do to support Ready Readers skills. Children learn language by listening to others around them speak.

When children listen to spoken words they learn:

- How words sound.
- The meanings of words.
- Words can be put together to communicate ideas and information.

Tips for parents:

- Ask questions and listen to the answers.
 Children learn by talking.
- Talk about books that you've read.
- If you speak more than one language, use your first language most often.



Singing

Singing is not only fun, it's also a natural way to learn language and boost vocabulary.

When children sing they:

- Develop listening skills.
- Pay attention to the rhythms and rhymes of language.
- Hear the different parts of words.

Tips for parents:

- Clap along to songs to help children hear syllables and improve motor skills.
- Sing songs more than once.

Writing

Writing goes along with reading. Writing also includes drawing and telling stories about the pictures.

Drawing and writing help children:

 Develop hand-eye coordination to develop the fine-motor skills they need in order to write.

Tips for parents:

- Encourage children to sign their names on drawings or label the different parts.
- Scribbling is good this is the way children learn to write.

Reading

Reading and sharing books together with children excites them, so they'll want to read on their own.

When families read together, children:

- Expand vocabulary.
- Learn how books and written language work.
- Learn how stories have a beginning, a middle and an end.

Tips for parents:

- Share stories that you love.
- Talk about illustrations.
- Ask children to turn the pages.
- Underline repeated phrases with your finger as you read.

Playing

Playing is the work of children. It is one of the very best ways to learn language and literacy skills.

Playing helps children:

- Practice putting thoughts into words.
- Develop narrative skills.
- Act out real situations and use imagination to solve problems.

Tips for parents:

Don't spend a lot of money on toys kids can do a lot with a stick, a box, or pots and pans.







"Just Right"

Finding just the right book for a young reader can be like a treasure hunt!

Ask your reader the questions on the back of this page to point you in the right direction for a "just right" book. "Just right" books are ones that match your child's reading level, in a subject that will delight and intrigue them.

A library staff member can also recommend "just right" books especially for your reader.



"Just Right"

- What types of things do you like to read about? Finding a book that contains subject matter of interest to the reader will not only keep the reader engaged, but can also help to develop an interest in other subject areas.
- Do you like to read made up stories or learning books? Not all young readers enjoy reading just fiction. If the child is more interested in learning about things in the world, indulge that interest with nonfiction titles.
- What do you think this book is about? Does it sound like a book you might enjoy?
 Beginning readers get their minds ready to read their "just-right" book by looking at the cover and title, and by reading the description on the inside of the cover flap.
- Have you read a book this long before? Young readers develop confidence by reading books that are not too long and when ready, they can challenge themselves by choosing a book that is longer than what they typically read.
- Is the size of the letters in this book too small for you?

 Beginning readers look for a balance of illustrations and text. They choose books with print size that is comfortable.
- Can you read and understand words chosen from the beginning, middle and end of the book?
 The ability to recognize and read familiar words is important for your

The ability to recognize and read familiar words is important for young readers. Take a "book walk" through the pages to find a "just-right" book.

- Who are some of your favorite authors?
 Many authors write in series or have an individual, recognizable style.
 Young readers can be attracted to the way a particular author writes and will feel comfortable with the continuity of style.
- What is a book that you have recently enjoyed?
 Knowing the title of a book that a young reader has enjoyed can point you towards books that are similar in character, author or genre.
